EVACUATION PLANNING FOR PETS

CREATE A PET EVACUATION KIT:

- Food and water (3 to 5 day supply)
- Medications & veterinary records
- Leash, collar, and ID tags
- First aid kit
- Carrier or crate
- Comfort items (toy, blanket)

KNOW YOUR EXITS:

Designate two escape routes from your home. Make sure crates and carriers are easily accessible. Practice fire drills with pets included!

WINDOW CLINGS SAVE LIVES:

Place a pet alert decal near front windows or doors. Include number and type of pets inside. First responders use these to locate animals.

IF YOU MUST EVACUATE. TAKE YOUR PETS!

Make an evacuation plan in advance. Know which hotels/motels allow companion animals on your route. Pre-arrange care plans with neighbors, if possible.

QUICK TIPS:

- Keep leashes near exits.
- Assign one family member to be in charge of pets during emergencies.
- Microchip your pet, it's the best chance of be reunited if you become separated.
